

## Defiance/Disrespect/Disruption

Defiance: challenging attitude or behavior; disregard or resistance to authority and rules.

Disrespect: using verbal language or body language that shows disregard or contempt for people or property.

Disruption: a behavior that prevents an individual or others from learning.

**Level 1:** Sent out of class, lunch detention. Conference with teacher.

**Level 2:** Sent out of class, lunch detention. Conference with teacher. Student must call parents (and/or coach). Suspension of off-campus privileges for five school days (5 days lunch detention for Jr. High).

**Level 3:** Sent out of class, lunch detention. Conference with teacher. Student must call parents (and/or coach). Suspension of off-campus privileges for 5 days. Parent meeting with administrator, student, teacher and possibly coach and counselor to develop a Behavior Contract. Possible Suspension.

**Level 4:** Administrative action taken based on agreed upon consequences outlined in the Behavior Contract.
