

Personal Electronic Devices

A Personal Electronic Device is any electrical device for personal use. These devices include, but are not limited to cell phones, music players, hand held gaming devices, and personal computers.

Unless explicitly indicated by a teacher, these devices are not allowed in the classroom during or between classes. These devices may be used outside of the classroom during break and lunch and between classes. When a student enters a classroom, these devices should be turned off and put away where they are out of sight or reach.

Using a device during class time, even if the student is not physically in the classroom (i.e. bathroom breaks), is also not allowed without explicit permission.

All content that is accessed or shared, either between devices or by accessing the internet, must adhere to school rules while the device is on campus.

Levels Of Consequences

Level 1: Device is taken. Call home. Parent picks up phone. Parent conference.

Level 2: Device is taken. Call home. Parent picks up phone. Parent conference. Student loses device privileges for the year.

Level 3: If a student brings a device once they have lost privileges, this will be dealt with as an issue of defiance. Additional loss of privileges to be determined by administration.
